Photos let contributors see where money goes

FAYETTEVILLE - The "before" and "after" photos of Sarah Fennel's work on a Kenyan orphanage rer transformation from a plain cinderblock building to respectable living quarters.

Fennel's Fayetteville-based Restore Humanity added a latrine and kitchen building, then blanketed it ; coat of white paint. The blue and green trim were a little harder to see in the pictures displayed on a tr in the dimly lighted Pratt Place Barn.

But even without the visuals, guests at Restore Humanity's Oct. 16 Pacific Pour fundraiser knew all F accomplished.

It was their generosity that funded the construction, and on that night, she counted on them for more. weekend's event raised \$17,000 toward \$100,000 needed to open the orphanage and keep it running year.

Pratt Place Inn and Barn owners Jane and Julian Archer donated the use of the venue, and Glazer's I donated the beverages - 75 or more wines from vine-rich Oregon, Washington state and Idaho. Papa (Fennel's father, Bordino's owner Joe Fennel) let go of some pricey wines with a carnival-type ring to "Carny in the Corner."

"He was definitely the hit of the party," Sarah Fennel said later.

Several also signed up for the "Empower a Child" program, in which donors give \$25 or more per mor with the care of a child. Cost per child annually is estimated at nearly \$1,500.
